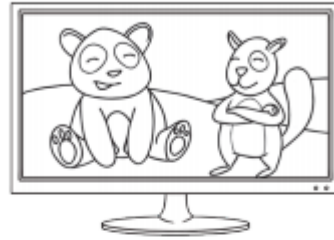

Working Dogs

The *Garda Dog Unit* was set up about 60 years ago. Down through the years, the unit has grown and become a vital part of policing. The main *Dog Support Unit* is based at Kilmainham Garda Station, Dublin.

Garda dogs assist in searches for suspects of crime. Most of the Garda dogs are detector dogs. These dogs are trained to detect illegal drugs. The remaining dogs are cadaver dogs and help to recover missing persons on land and from water. Dogs can do what no human or machine can do, by virtue of their keen sense of smell. Many discoveries of people, drugs and explosives would be impossible without their assistance.

It takes at least eight weeks to train a dog to search for drugs and explosives, and up to 14 weeks to train it to search for missing people. After the training is completed, the dog and its handler start work, although ongoing training is provided on a regular basis. The dog lives in the home of its handler, so they build a good working relationship with each other.

The charity *Irish Guide Dogs for the Blind* works hard to supply guide dogs to help people with poor sight. It is vital that these dogs have the best possible Temperament. This is why the charity breeds its own dogs. These dogs help their owners with sight loss to lead better lives.
