I think he is doing this for somebody, so they can go in the hot air balloon to see the views of the countryside that is all around them.

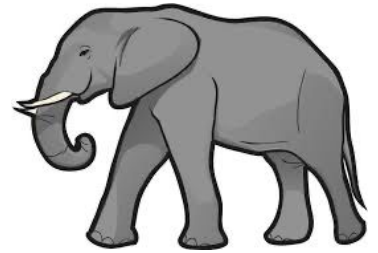
