





The Lungs and the Breathing Process

The lungs are part of the respiratory system and it controls your breathing. They are responsible for swapping gases and this process is called gaseous exchange.


You have two lungs which look like spongy bags filled with lots of tiny air sacs. These air sacs are called alveoli and there are over 300 million in an adult.

Your lungs are protected by a part of your skeleton called the ribcage and you inhale (breathe in)oxygen and you exhale (breathe out) carbon dioxide.

Oxygen travels from our lungs to our muscles in our blood which they then use for energy.

Plants are very similar to humans however they take in carbon dioxide and give off oxygen and are extremely important to human life.
