I used paragraphs to help the reader to show when there was a change in time or place.			
I concluded with an overall comment on the event, e.g. a reflection on what happened or insight to the future.

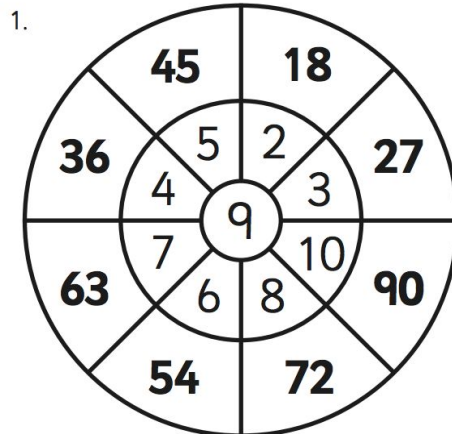

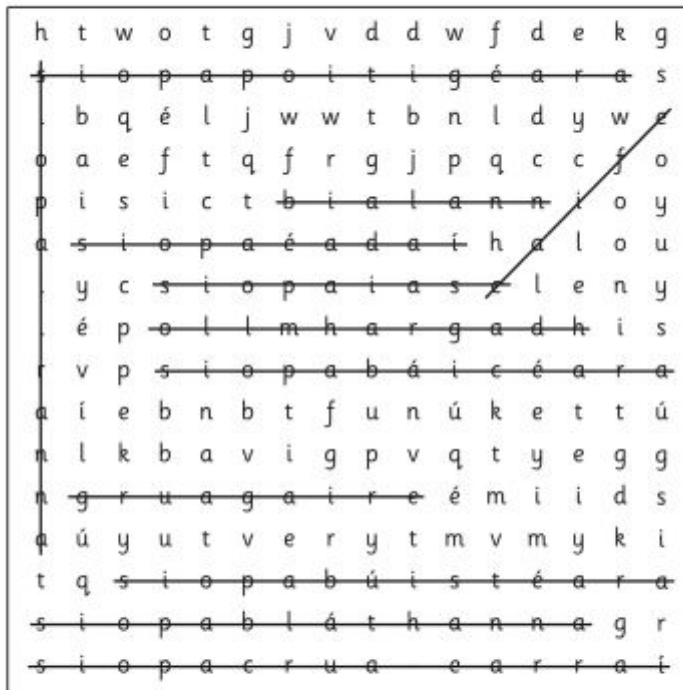
