





Wednesday Music:

<u>a)</u>

- 1. This music is traditionally from Vietnam. It is called Vietnamese music.
- 2. Some traditional Vietnamese musical instruments are *monochord zither, moon-shaped two-string lute* and *pear-shaped lute with four strings*. One of the best-known instruments is the Đàn Tranh or the 16-string Zither. They also use bamboo, brass se (a triangle like instrument) or the hne (like the oboe). In the musical piece Ha Long Bay, they use Dan Tranh, bamboo flute, Tam Thap Luc and traditional drums, Trong coms.
- 3. The music makes me feeleg relaxed and peaceful because the instruments have soft sounds and are played slowly. I can imagine myself meditating to this music.
- 4. This traditional music is much different to pop music in Ireland today. We use computers and technology to create, tone and autotune the sounds and voices in pop music. Another difference is that pop songs have singers which this music didn't have. Most pop songs wouldn't have hand drums or wind instruments such as flutes/ oboes whereas this style of music does.


