<u>How do Bees make Honey?</u> <u>Beekeeping with Maddie #13</u> <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=AECtOFpbgVs</u> What is Honey? Honey is a sweet food made by bees. How does it happen? Honeybees collect sugary water (nectar) from flowers. They bring it home to the hive. They pass it to other bees (stomach to stomach or vomit). Then they store it in wax cells called honeycomb to store it. After a while, the water evaporates and we're left with honey. Where does it happen? In a beehive. When does it happen? Mainly in spring and summer. Why does it happen? Bees harvest pollen & nectar from flowers as food for themselves and store it for the winter months. What is it used for? Humans collect and eat honey. It's also used in skin treatments and is thought to help out with hayfever! Are there any interesting facts about bees? The boss bee is called the Queen. Worker bees are female. Bees can carry their body weight in pollen. Honeybees collect more pollen than Bumblebees. Special features: How is honey plentiful? Humans have to be responsible when they collect honey. They have to leave some there for the bees to eat, otherwise the bees will die and there will be no

more honey. Humans build hives for bees to protect the bees from animal attacks.
